The Idaho Snotel report shows we are about normal for the date as far as Snow Water Equivalent at 122% and Water-Year-to-Date Precipitation at 99%. The 14-day forecast shows some snow in sight with the biggest dumps looking to be what is last Saturday now and today, as you read this, December 20th. Christmas, it just looks COLD!

As much trouble and damage as it caused, I suppose I am a bit off in the head remembering back at liking all the white stuff last year. At present the water being released from the dam is at 5800 cfs and will increase to 7800 cfs as you read this. The Bureau of Reclamation will begin releasing more water to help protect the rip-rap that lines the banks of the reservoir. The ice sheet is continuing to build over the reservoir and if water levels remain the same or increase heavy winds and ice could cause severe damage to the protective rock structure. The winter fishing season may be entirely different in terms of water levels than those I have fished here in the past. I very much enjoyed the fall fishing season while it lasted.

I look forward to time spent with family in the days to come. Any more that is what the season brings to me; like the evening a few weeks ago at Saint John's it fills me with warmth and peace. As you prepare for whatever it is you do during the holidays I hope that if you or your family travels it is done safely. The forecast looks decent for travel but one seldom knows at this time of year.

As those who know ventured out into the cold night air to view your Christmas and Holiday spirit their evaluation technique seemed a bit more beyond, "Oh, Papa I like that one a lot!" This year they wanted to give stars to all the houses we looked at. They wanted to use a five stars scale; suffice it to say the "Oh I like that one a lot" scale was much easier and less time consuming. After some negotiations we settled on 5 Stars, 4 Stars and Very Merry. Their results are not ranked beyond that; I am sorry but Papa didn't have the patience to mediate every contested consideration. One thing we did add this year was the three best streets and they did agree on these. They include Hutchison, Bennett from Polk to Ralphs and Autumn Way. I want to thank each of you for sharing your spirit of the season with all of us. I can only say I wish I had the imagination and energy as so many of you.
